

BART'S COMMUNITY UPDATE By Shaun Crompton.

Things are changing in Bart's group as traditionally higher ranking individuals are aging and beginning to struggle to compete with some of the ambitious younger members. These matters are certainly not helped by Bart's laidback approach to leadership.



Bart - After a lifetime of being pampered by his group, Bart can be quite a lazy boy. This shows during feeding times where, rather than forage for his food, he waits for Toprish to gather a load of food before mugging her! Failing that he comes to find Primate Care Staff and pouts at them until they feed him. His diet is an important part of his diabetes management, so we can't ignore him!

Busta, who is an older male, has dropped in status within the community with Gamba and Toprish giving him a hard time. It occasionally gets to him (resulting in very loud tantrums), but he remains a silly and playful chap who is always up for a game of chase, though he's not as fast as he used to be!

Gamba is a mischievous and occasionally mean-spirited bully. It is not ideal for the group that Gamba is Bart's second in command but fortunately for them he has a great deal of respect and fear for the boss which helps keep his naughtier impulses in check. Primate Care Staff can tell if he's overstepped and been told off as he becomes uncharacteristically sweet before returning to being a loveable nuisance.

Micky sensibly avoids conflict and instead focuses on what makes him happy - food and lots of it. After eating his own portion, he attempts to beg for food from the one chimp in the group who definitely will not share, greedy old Beth! Primate Care Staff have yet to see this strategy work, but he tries almost daily and we all admire his

Athena is normally a shy and quiet little lady but has recently become more assertive and strategically cosies up to Bart. Her potential advancement up the ranks has not changed her sweet and gentle nature and she wisely chooses to stay out of most group disputes.

Beth - Several of the individuals in Bart's group receive extra food from Primate Care Staff to bump up their caloric intake. Despite being quite a large lady Beth has decided that she too needs "extras" and is always around when they are handed out. She isn't very pushy and happily receives some low calorie squash as a reward for not trying to steal food from the people who actually

Bixa was always close to Paddy and now she never far away from Bart. This can be a problem for Primate Care Staff during Bart's blood glucose & ketone tests, as she seems to worry we are hurting him and attempts to stop us. Luckily Bart is very helpful and calmly reassures her but if that doesn't work he will physically restrain her while the test

Cathy is close friends with the other former laboratory chimps, Clin and Grisby, and is usually found in their company. She sometimes guards her friends and attempts to stop Primate Care Staff from interacting with them by storming over and aggressively blowing air in our faces in order to shoo us away. Every now and then she drops the serious facade and joins in the silly games.

Clin is as weird and wonderful as ever. Primate Care Staff are often serenaded by her unique 'singing'. Once an infamous food hoarder, she is no longer so obsessive and



quietly takes her portions away from the group to eat in peace. As she's a slender chimp. Primate Care Staff provide her with extra calories that she eats slowly to savour the flavour,


unlike close friend Grisby who inhales hers in seconds before begging for some of Clin's!

Chatta is one of the few female chimps at the park who regularly has a sexual swelling despite being on birth control. This makes her very attractive to males, though only Gamba seems interested and follows her relentlessly whilst she is in swell. Chatta mostly ignores him, seeming much more interested in Paco over in the Bachelors!

Cindy has seemed more stressed maintaining her position this past year with young Toprish nipping at her heels. However, she is still Bart's favourite lady, and it's not unusual for Primate Care Staff to hear Cindy's laughter at the start of the day when Bart wraps her up in a blanket and playfully wrestles with her.

Eddi has not used her familial bond with Bart to advance her position in the group and is content being away from all the drama! That being said she is no pushover and will go up against her brother to defend others or if she feels unfairly treated by him.





Lola's nervous disposition means she constantly thinks everyone is out to get her, which isn't the case unless Gamba is

she behaves herself

involved. She begs for reassurance over imagined threats, and is so persistent that she gets told off when they get annoyed by her whining...which leads to more whining! Bart is very good and often grooms her to help settle her down.

Toprish - Though she is now mostly a well-adjusted young chimp, Toprish's former life as a pet has left her much more selfish and volatile than her group mates, with most of them treading lightly around her. Her tendency to lash out led Primate Care Staff to train her to cooperate with having her nails filed down to blunt them, as she was using them to deal out some guite nasty injuries!

Peppa likes to keep out of trouble and is often found on her own. However, she is the first one to rush in if anyone is sick or injured, sticking by their side until they've recovered. She's also one of the few females in the group who defends Gamba's bad behaviour. Their relationship is completely one sided as he never sticks his neck out to defend her!

and Bulu Mata as they have really matured




GORDON'S GROUP By Jeremy Keeling






BRYAN'S GROUP

avoiding any high rankers who might try to take anything from him.



Your donations are helpful on all levels - from very generous legacies, supermarket shops and Wishlist purchases. to donations of old sheets and blankets for bedding, it all helps us to keep our costs down. Like everyone, our family here at the park are struggling financially with soaring costs of food, electricity, oil, and building materials, it is very difficult and worrying time for all.

In Vietnam, our sister sanctuary Dao Tien also continues to receive confiscated and needy endangered primates. The arrival of nine pygmy loris, two Annamese langurs, and two black-shanked douc over the past year has highlighted that the illegal trade in primates continues regardless of Covid 19 or runaway inflation. We are doing our best to support their rehabilitation and release work and hope to be moving ahead with more releases of primates back into continuous forest in 2023.

All of this would not be possible without you, our adoptive parents! We wanted to let you know we are changing our membership cards for long lasting ones that do not need to be re-issued every year. The cards are durable, significantly cut the amount of plastic we are using, and include a QR code that you can scan to watch and listen to our primate care staff talks wherever you are in the world! Renewals will be done in the usual way, but once you have received your new card, all subsequent renewals will only include your certificate and primate photo. The new cards and certificates look great and we hope you like them.
