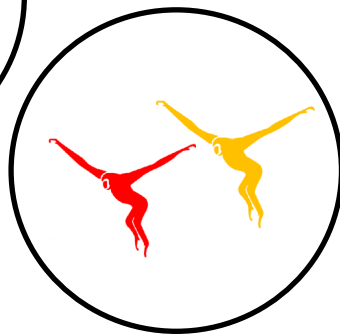
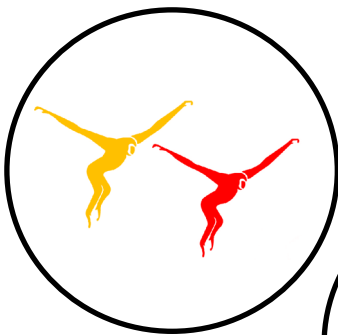

Families are one of the most important things for our rescued primates.

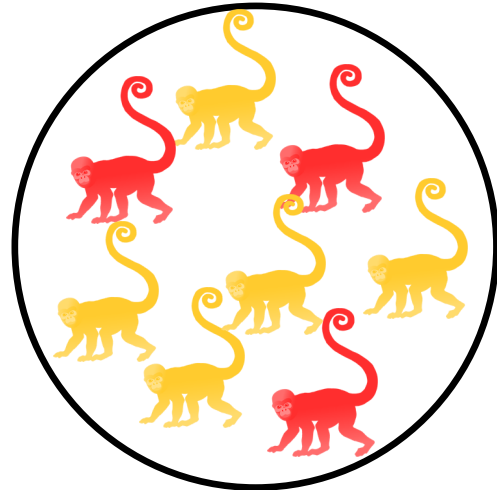
To learn more about primate families, work through the slides on our **Social Organisation** lesson, then complete the follow-up activities below!
